Simon Sandler is a researcher at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) in the Complex Decision Analysis group. He has been at NREL for 2 years and has over 5 years of combined experience working in technoeconomic and policy analysis of renewable energy (solar, storage, energy efficiency, wind, and more) in both the public and private sector. He has an engineering background, obtaining a B.S. in civil engineering before getting his M.S. in Sustainable Energy Systems. His current work at NREL is focused on policy and modeling of distributed solar and storage. Projects he works on include the National Community Solar Partnership+, Federal Energy Management Program, and the Environmental Protection Agency's Solar For All program.

Sudha Kannan, Ph.D is a Researcher at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL). She is an applied economist with education and experience in energy, environment, and climate change. At NREL, she leads the data collection for and program evaluation of Sharing the Sun, the database of the community solar projects in the U.S. as part of the National Community Solar Partnership program+ of the Department of Energy. She also serves as the gender expert for the USAID-NREL portfolio. She previously worked at the State of Michigan's Public Service Commission/Energy Office. She served on the team of UNDP's Bureau of Policy and Programme Support (BPPS) to analyze the impacts of climate change on sub-Saharan African agriculture. She is also a Fulbright awardee, and her key research work has been published in Nature Energy, Energy Research & Social Science, Energy for Sustainable Development, and Frontiers in Climate.
